



Check first as not all trains stop at Collington (the London one does) If coming by bus from Brighton or Hastings the no. 99 stops in Wickham Avenue, about 10 mins walk away. Programme Sunday 25th July

It has been particularly requested that we take time off today to take part in the morning service at Orange Street, Congregational Church, where the Identity message is preached.

Whether this will be feasible, depends on whether the trains will be running without a replacement bus interruption to the journey, From enquires already made it appears that there will be no problem on the day. It also depends on whether the Orange Street Church will be open, as over recent months it has been closed on a number of Sundays because there was no preacher.

For those wishing to participate, it would be necessary to be at Collington Station at 8.25 am for the 8.30 train arriving at Victoria at 10.36 am and then a 10 min bus ride to Trafalgar Square for the service starting at 11am.

Afterwards it is planned to go to St. Martins in the Field crypt cafe for refreshments.

Special rail tickets can be obtained enabling 4 to travel to London and back for £20 that is £5 each.

As an alternative if it does not prove possible to travel to London, then it is planned to be present at St. Pauls Free Church's morning service at 11am

On return to Bexhill there will be time for relaxation and conversation.

Programme Monday 26th July

Some of our Dutch guests will be leaving today, but for those remaining, the informal programme will be continuing and an opportunity to discuss how best to forward the message of our identity in the UK and in particular to our brethren in continental Europe and alert them to the present dangers and to occupy until Yahweh returns, for in putting our trust in him we need have no fear.

Time permitting, there will be an update on the progress in translating Paul Senstius's work on the origin of the Germans and Israelite tribes. There will also be an opportunity to further discuss and seek further information on Alan Patterson's re-publishing the book on Ancient Caledonia.
